COVID-19 Vaccine Member Communications:

National Outreach

UnitedHealthcare is starting to email members 65 and older in all states (excluding New Mexico and Hawaii) informing them of their ability to take steps to get an FDA-authorized COVID-19 vaccine. In addition, we will continue to email members as vaccine eligibility opens to other populations such as high-risk and below 65. Outreach has also begun to members who have received their first COVID-19 vaccine to remind them to receive their second dose if applicable.

Members can find details through their [state health departments](#) and speak with their primary care provider or other health care professional about vaccine recommendations given their specific health conditions.
